
A MONUMENTAL Gift

SCULPTOR HAROLD HOLDEN'S BRUSH WITH DEATH



Harold Holden, Lung Transplant Recipient & "Thank You, Lord" Sculptor

It was the summer of 2010. Pulmonary fibrosis, a debilitating lung disease, had renowned western artist and prolific sculptor Harold T. Holden on his deathbed. With only a few weeks left to live, he shut down his studio, settled his accounts and said goodbye to his loved ones.

Then the phone rang.

"I was about as close as you get to dying when we got the call," said Holden. Soon he was under the care of a seven-member transplant team at the Nazih Zuhdi Transplant Institute—the **only solid organ comprehensive transplant center in the state.** The new lung breathed the gift of new life into Holden.

"To wake up after surgery with a new lung ... and essentially **be given a second chance** is overwhelming," Holden said.

Today, his **gratitude to God** — and to the team that helped save his life — is enshrined in a donated recasting of Holden's six-foot sculpture, "**Thank You, Lord.**" It stands proudly at the Nazih Zuhdi Transplant Institute.
